Before coming to UCSD, he was a Congressional Fellow in the office of U.S. Congressman Michael Honda. His research focuses on immigration, race, ethnicity, inequality, and assimilation. He is currently completing a book manuscript which examines how Mexican immigration influences the assimilation of established, long-standing Mexican Americans. Professor Jiménez is also a fellow at the New America Foundation and a visiting research fellow at the Center for U.S.-Mexican Studies.
