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The First scenario allow us to buy corn form Brazil (68%), Argentina(7%) and Canada (25%) at 80 dlls per ton, equal to US cost.

The Second Scenario allows us to buy corn at a less final cost.

#### We can save 2 dollars by ton or 15 million dollars each year.




